Creating a new album of songs to express the well-worn path of December standards is a tall order, but that's exactly what songwriter William Schermerhorn does incredibly well with this project. On *The Hope of Christmas*, vocalist Ann Hampton Calloway is enlisted to bring the words Schermerhorn developed with the help of a bevy of co-writers, including the singer. Other collaborators on the effort include Wesley Whatley, Stephen Fox, Mary Ehlinger, Michael Feinstein and Milton Delugg. The music is wonderful original and contemporary with many capturing the feel of the standards and others bringing an entirely new vibe to the table. It's soulful. It's jazzy and it works. Hampton Calloway's delivery of the tunes is ideal for the project. Guests on the effort include saxophonist Gerald Albright, vocal quartet New York Voices, flutist Hubert Laws, trombonist Michael Davis, bassist James Genus, pianist Ted Rosenthal and drummers Sherrie Maricale and Mark Walker, among others. This recording is a welcome addition to the new holiday music collection.
